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Covid Absence Update

As of November 4, the Quebec government has decided to end the mandatory isolation period for individuals who test positive for covid. This means that any teacher who tests positive for covid can continue their regular activities, including going to work, as long as they are fever-free. More information about how you should proceed in the event of a positive covid test can be found here.

If you are too ill to work, then the EMSB will use your sick days, as for any other illness. If you feel there is strong evidence that you caught Covid while at work, please contact Nadia for advice on filing a CNESST claim.

If you tested positive for covid and were in isolation using sick days prior to November 4, <u>please contact Peter</u> with the details so a grievance can be filed on your behalf.

Sick Days for Hourly-Paid Teachers

Hourly-paid teachers in Adult Education and Vocational Training have access to a certain number of paid days for some life events, such as illness, a death in the family, or the birth of a child. Concordia Initiative for Teachers





Have you figured out some new and exciting ways to deliver the curriculum? Have you used mobile or computer technology in a fresh and innovative way in your classroom? Do you know a fellow teacher who is implementing creative teaching practices?

Concordia University's Centre for the Study of Learning and Performance (CSLP), a government-recognized educational research centre, is launching a new initiative to recognize and celebrate the outstanding work that teachers are doing in their classrooms – the CSLP Pedagogical Innovation Awards.

These awards have three purposes: first, to recognize innovative teaching practices; second, to bring teachers together with educational researchers to discuss how their innovations connect with recent research findings; and third, to spread the word about these innovative practices to other teachers and researchers. This year, the CSLP will offer two awards of \$1000.

Winners will be invited to present their innovation at a CSLP Symposium held in April 2023, at which educational researchers will be on hand to dialogue with them about their work.

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In addition, with technical assistance from the CSLP, winners will also be invited to make a YouTube capsule to showcase their work to other teachers in Quebec.

<u>Please complete the brief initial</u> <u>application form</u>, describing the teaching innovation you or your colleague has developed. It only takes a few minutes to enter.

The deadline for contest entries is January 15, 2023.

Finalists will be notified by February 1, 2023, with finalists' applications (which will consist of a longer description of the innovation) due February 22, 2023. Winners will be announced on March 1, 2023, and the awards symposium will be held in April of 2023, the exact date to be determined later.
